1. Apologies

No apologies were received.

2. Confirmation of Agenda

The agenda was confirmed.

3. Declarations of Interest

Bryan Jackson registered an interest relating to Item 11c, Board paper 09/04/0187 - "Funding Auckland Passenger Rail Stations from the National Land Transport Programme" relating to his directorship of kiwi Rail Holdings Ltd.

Paul Fitzharris noted that, regarding Item 16c, Board paper O9/04/0178 - "Delegation to and Authorisation of Agents in respect of Motor Vehicle and Driver Licensing, Driver Testing and Road User Licensing Services", one of the NZ Transport Agency's agents, New Zealand Driver Licensing 1988 Ltd, which provides practical driver licence testing, is owned by Mr Fitzharris's long-time friend and former NZ Police colleague, Mr Roger Marley, with whom Mr Fitzharris is still in social contact. However, Mr Fitzharris has no interest, financial or otherwise, in Mr Morley's business.

Tauranga Eastern Motorway Toll Development - Consultation

- d approves undertaking public consultation on advancing the completion of the Toll Eastern Motorway by the use of debt funding repaid by tolling;
- e **delegates** the approval of the Toll Eastern Motorway Consultation Strategy and communications material to the Group Manager, Highways and Network Operations;
- f agrees that the Toll Eastern Motorway consultation material will provide the choice between a definitive project start enabled by tolling versus an indefinite start without tolling;
- g agrees that the toll tariff to be included in the Toll Eastern Motorway consultation shall be a single maximum figure; and
- h **requests** the following feedback on the Toll Eastern Motorway consultation should be noted:.
 - I. the wording in all communications and customer facing material should be customer friendly and free from technical jargon;
 - II. the toll tariff should take account of any indications on willingness to pay parameters as evidenced in the early performance of the Northern Gateway Toll Road;
 - III. the Minister's opinion should be sought in respect of any perceived toll 'cap' following pre-election quotes to the media;
 - IV. the communications material needs to carefully handle the Toll Eastern Motorway's status as a road of national significance and how this relates to the regional funding gap as stated in the draft RLTP; and
 - V. where possible, focus groups or similar should be used to evaluate the suitability of communications material prior to general release.

11c Funding Auckland Passenger Rail Stations from the National Land Transport Programme

Board paper 09/04/0187

Resolved:

That the New Zealand Transport Agency Board:

a **agrees** to consider for inclusion in the 2009/2012 National Land Transport

Programme (NLTP) and subsequent funding, Newmarket and Morningside Auckland
passenger rail station upgrades (which are under contract for construction); subject to:

- the Minister rescinding the previous cabinet instruction that the NZ Transport Agency funding assistance rate for Auckland Passenger Rail infrastructure development is to be 0%
- the Minister increasing the funding range for the proposed GPS activity class 'public transport infrastructure' to ensure that the NLTP can comply with the Government Policy Statement funding ranges;
- iii. inclusion of the projects in the Auckland Regional Council's (ARC's) Long Term Council Community Plan and the Auckland Regional Transport Authority's (ARTA's) Regional Land Transport Programme; and
- iv. confirmation that the projects meet LTMA funding and procurement requirements;
- b **agrees** that, if required, it will consider lending the remaining 40% local share to ARC/ARTA for Newmarket and Morningside station upgrades only, for a maximum period of 5 years at an appropriate interest rate, with the ability to capitalise interest into the loan if necessary;
- c **agrees** to consider for inclusion in the NLTP other station upgrades on a case-by-case basis, subject to an assessment of those projects and subject to their meeting the same requirements as set out in a (i-iv) above; and
- d **agrees** to take Board paper 09/04/0187 out of Committee when the Board has informed the Minister of Transport of its decision.

12c NZ Transport Agency: (SH1) Waikato Expressway Strategy Support and Project Investigation and Design Funding

Board paper 09/04/0173

Resolved:

That the New Zealand Transport Agency Board:

- a supports the Waikato Expressway component of the Waikato Expressway Strategy, which includes the proposed expressway from Mercer to south of Cambridge and Hamilton's Te Rapa Bypass;
- b agrees to the variation of NZ Transport Agency's 2008/2009 Land Transport Programme to accommodate the Tamahere 4 laning project, and approves its addition to the 2008/2009 National Land Transport Programme (NLTP), subject to appropriate consultation being undertaken to enable its addition to the NLTP;

c **approves** funding for the further investigation and specimen design of NZ Transport Agency's Waikato Expressway projects, at a total estimated cost of \$29.6 million from R funds, as set out in the table below:

Project	Estimated phase cost
Longswamp to Rangiriri 4 laning	\$2.6 million
Huntly Bypass	\$10.7 million
Hamilton Bypass	\$13.1 million
Tamahere 4 laning	\$3.2 million

subject to:

- i. the establishment of hold points to allow the Group Manager, Regional Partnerships and Planning to consider and approve each of the project macroscopes and the resulting strategy macroscope, which will include a reevaluation of the economics of the complete strategy; and
- ii. consideration by the Group Manager, Highways and Networks Operations during the investigation of Huntly and Hamilton Bypasses, as to whether lower scope options that deliver a free flowing highway within the designation can provide better value for money solutions than the currently identified preferred options;
- d. notes that property purchase for the four projects would normally be triggered by macroscope approval, but the NZ Transport Agency intends to take advantage of market opportunities and advance property purchase;
- e. **notes** that Hamilton City Council, Waikato District Council, Waipa District Council, and Environment Waikato have completed the sub-regional integrated transport and growth strategy ("Future Proof"), is being incorporated into the Regional Policy Statement;
- f. **notes** that the construction cost for the remaining projects on the Waikato Expressway, including Te Rapa Bypass but excluding Hamilton Southern Links, is estimated at around \$1.72 billion and the total 95th percentile at \$2.25 billion;
- g. **notes** the reasons for this decision are as set out in the Reasons for recommendation section; and
- h. **agrees** to take Board paper 09/04/0173 out of Committee when the Board has published the notice of decision.

14c NZ Transport Agency: (SH2) Tauranga Northern Arterial – Secondary Investigation Funding

Resolved:

That the New Zealand Transport Agency Board:

- a. approves funding for the secondary investigation of New Zealand Transport Agency's SH2 Tauranga Northern Arterial project, at an estimated cost of \$3.20 million from R funds, subject to a hold point before changes to the designation are notified to allow the Group Manager, Regional Partnerships and Planning to confirm the revised macroscope;
- b. notes that funding of further stages for this project will be subject to the SmartTransport Partners meeting the conditions of support for the Northern Corridor Strategy, as set out in Board paper 09/04/0179;
- c. **notes** that the construction cost for the Tauranga Northern Arterial is estimated at \$196 million, the 95th percentile construction cost is estimated at \$245 million and the 5th percentile at \$164 million;
- d. **notes** the reasons for this decision are as set out in the Reasons for recommendation section; and
- e. **agrees** to take Board paper 09/04/0176 out of Committee when the Board has published the notice of decision.

15c Hamilton City Council: Waiere Drive Arterial (Crosby Road to Cobham Drive) – Investigation and Design Funding

Board paper 09/04/0172

Resolved:

That the New Zealand Transport Agency Board:

- a. approves funding for the investigation and design of Hamilton City Council's
 Wairere Drive Arterial (Crosby Road to Cobham Road) project, at an estimated cost of
 \$2.92 million and a funding assistance rate of 55% (NZ Transport Agency's share
 \$1.61 million) from R funds, subject to Hamilton City Council agreeing to:
 - a hold point at specimen design to confirm that information from further investigation of the NZ Transport Agency's Hamilton Bypass project confirms that the scope of this project represents value for money;
 - ii. investigate opportunities for third party contributions against the total cost of the project and incorporating these opportunities. prior to applying for funding for construction; and
 - iii. review the project for consistency against the strategic objectives of the revised Access Hamilton strategy prior to applying for construction funding;
- b. requests the Group Manager, Regional Partnerships and Planning to request the Waikato Regional Transport Committee to review the priority of the project and its recommended use of R funds, prior to an application for construction funding, taking into account that the draft Regional Land Transport Programme does not reflect the property costs associated with the project;
- c. **notes** that the construction cost for the Wairere Drive Arterial (Crosby Road to Cambridge Road) is estimated at \$61 million, the 95th percentile construction cost is estimated at \$69 million and the 5th percentile at \$56 million;
- d. **notes** the reasons for this decision are as set out in the Reasons for recommendation section; and
- e. **agrees** to take Board paper 09/04/0174 out of Committee when the Board has published the notice of decision.

- d. notes that contract negotiations with the agents are progressing, and that although new contracts may not be in place by 30 April 2009, the new delegations and authorisations will apply to the existing contracts and then to the new contracts once they come into effect; and
- e. **agrees** to take Board paper 09/03/0178 out of Committee when a decision has been reached.
