
The New Zealand Government has made it clear that


- RUC is here to stay,

NZ take up of EROAD ERUC has been very fast.





Case result: PCL – Explore the potential

savings based on Idle time reduced from 30 hrs to six hours a week. = saving of \$720/ week = \$37,000.00/ year.

lowered average speed by 10-15km/hr, fuel saving/ day 10-15% around \$35,000.00/yr


When a truck is Idling it is doing 20% more damage to the motor and is emitting twice as many emissions than normal running.

TOTAL SAVING: \$80,000 per year



ORS, ACC reforms and RUC Act 2012 all significantly increase scrutiny and risks around commercial transport but provide opportunities for compliant operators:

- more stringent regulations around hubodometer and odometer tampering;
- > distance-based evasion will be main focus of enforcement;
- requirement to create and keep RUC, fuel and service records for up to 6 years;
- updated offences and penalties;
- separate penalties for corporate and individuals;
- > experience rating for ACC premiums based on claims history;
- increased chain-of-responsibility exposures; and
- > driver offence notices given a weighting of 39%-63% by ORS.
