Request made under the Official Information Act 1982

Thank you for your email of 29 July 2020 requesting the following information under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act):

An itemised list of all spending on the Road to Zero project to date.

The Government launched *Road to Zero: New Zealand's road safety strategy 2020-2030* in December 2019. Road to Zero sets out guiding principles for how the road network should be designed as well as targets and outcomes for 2030. It sets out five areas to focus on over the next decade, and a framework for how the Government will hold itself to account.

The strategy will be implemented through a series of action plans that will outline the steps required to drive change, as well as the timelines and responsibilities for implementing them. The initial action plan sets out the fifteen immediate actions to focus on for 2020-2022. You can find the initial action plan on the Ministry of Transport's website at: www.transport.govt.nz/assets/Import/Uploads/Our-Work/Documents/Road-to-Zero-Action-Plan_Final.pdf.

The *Road to Zero* strategy is an all-of-system approach to reducing deaths and serious injuries and will be delivered by a range of government agencies, including: Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency, the Ministry of Transport, NZ Police and local councils.
