**Request made under the Official Information Act 1982**

Thank you for your email of 17 of January 2023 requesting the following information under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act):

*I want to know how many people have died after being struck by a vehicle whilst correctly using a pedestrian crossing*

*In the last 10 years, How many pedestrians have been killed after being hit by a vehicle when the pedestrians were using a zebra crossing in the correct manner?*

*Please provide details about the crashes and an exact location of those crashes and any relevant information about the circumstances surrounding the fatal crashes on pedestrian crossings*

*If possible please include a photograph of the pedestrian crossing where the pedestrians were killed (taken at or close to the time of the fatal crash occurring). I expect there will be photos you can send me from within the crash report that we're taken as part of the crash investigation and after the victims remains have been removed. Please only send photos that have been taken after the victims remains are removed or covered/ blanked out from images*

The data you requested is being provided to you in the attached spreadsheet:

The data in the spreadsheet should be read in conjunction with the caveats on the first page of the spreadsheet.

We have provided the factors contributing to the crashes involving pedestrians, however, these are provided in a summarised table in order to protect the privacy of individuals.

The last part of your request regarding photographs has been transferred to New Zealand Police to answer. Photographs form part of the Traffic Crash Reports (TCR). Section 211, of the Land Transport Act 1998, enables any person to make a request for Traffic Crash Reports held by New
