The Transport Agency, with CPB Contractors and Beca, are working to deliver the Bay Link project which will reduce congestion, improve safety, support the Bay of Plenty's economic growth, and protect efficient freight access to the Port of Tauranga.

Construction of two flyovers will form Bay Link, as well as improvements to the roundabout at the SH29A and Truman Lane intersection, and the SH2 / Maunganui-Girven Roads intersection.
