



Waka Kotahi is working with Rotorua Lakes Council to upgrade SH30A/Amohau Street from Old Taupō Road to Sala Street.

This project is part of the Connect Rotorua programme of work, in partnership with Rotorua Lakes Council, to futureproof two of the city's key transport networks: SH30/Te Ngae Road and SH30A/Amohau Street.

OBJECTIVES

- Improved safety
- Better opportunities for walking and cycling
- Support revitalisation of city centre
- Support tourism
- Improved access to/from local roads

THE IMPROVEMENTS

- New three-metre-wide shared path
- Widening existing paths
- On-road cycle lane
- Safety improvements to SH30A/
 Pukuatua Street intersection
- Signalised pedestrian crossings
- Upgrading existing crossing points

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

We've worked with Rotorua Lakes Council, tangata whenua, stakeholders, businesses and property owners on the corridor, as well as the general public to plan the improvements for SH30A/Amohau Street.

This included public open days in 2017 to present a shortlist of options and gather community feedback. In 2019, part way through the detailed design phase, we held information sessions to check in with the community again. Feedback received influenced the final design.
