

Why we need to future-proof Rotorua's transport network

Rotorua is a key hub for road transport connections for primary industries, tourism and links to the Port of Tauranga.

Central Corridor

SH30A / Amohau Street reduces accessibility into and within the city. This restricts options for the revitalisation of the Inner City.

Rotorua Lakes Council have prepared an Inner City Revitalisation Strategy and formed an Inner City Focus Group to guide work to create a vibrant city centre which attracts people and activity.

Eastern Corridor

The eastern corridor along Te Ngae Road is busy at peak times. The eastern suburbs are anticipated to provide future residential and business growth. Rotorua Lakes Council is currently preparing a spatial plan to provide direction for future growth in the city.
