

TWIN COAST DISCOVERY CORRIDOR PLAN

The NZ Transport Agency, on behalf of the NZ Government, has teamed up with a number of Government agencies, Northland Inc. and local and regional Councils to investigate future investment in the Twin Coast Discovery Route.

The Twin Coast Discovery Route was created in 1999 and is New Zealand's first official tourist route. Starting and ending in Auckland, the 800km circular driving route leads visitors around Northland, linking tourist destinations on both the east and west coasts. The route also connects communities and freight to main centres.

The corridor study will investigate how we can make the route safer and more reliable as well as provide better accessibility for tourists, local communities and freight.

We are now seeking public input into transport issues and opportunities to inform this programme of future investment.
