



Mt Iron roundabout





Road Closure ends ahead of schedule

If you've driven through the nearly completed roundabout, you'll know how much easier it is to travel through this busy SH6/SH84 intersection.

The finish line is in sight for the NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi's Fulton Hogan team working on the new Mt Iron roundabout, at the entrance to Wānaka, near Albert Town.

The last major detour for the project which involved closing the westbound lane of SH6 into Wānaka and detouring traffic via Ballantyne Road has been completed and re-opened to two-way traffic just over a week earlier than predicted. Fulton Hogan are still working to complete landscaping and drainage on road shoulders, line marking, signage, and grooving lines in the roundabout, and the work is still on track to be completed in April 2024.



Night Works – April 2024

As well as the finishing touches to landscaping and drainage on road shoulders, Fulton Hogan are also required to cut grooves into the asphalt of the roundabout and each of its legs for traction and drainage purposes.

To keep disruption to Wānaka residents and visitors to a minimum, this work will be done during the night. This will be noisy work. Manned temporary traffic lights will be set up at various parts of the roundabout to keep one lane at a time open and to allow the cutting of the grooves into the asphalt. Expect delays of up to 5 minutes at various times during these nights.

Timing: Nightwork will start around 8:00pm and finish by 5:00am each morning from Wednesday 10 April to Friday 12 April, and again on Sunday 14 and Monday 15 April.

Please ensure you allow extra time for any journeys during these nights and follow all traffic management crew directions to keep everyone safe.
