

NAU MAI, HAERE MAI

Waikato-Tainui and the New Zealand Government are hosting a celebration to mark completion of the Rangiriri Section of the Waikato Expressway and landscape works for the Rangiriri Paa.

The 4.8km Rangiriri section of the expressway has taken SH1 away from Rangiriri Paa – scene of the 1863 Battle of Rangiriri and starting point of the Waikato Land Wars – and allowed a symbolic reinterpretation of the site to be created.

This has been a unique collaboration between the Crown and Waikato-Tainui for the benefit of all New Zealanders.

Parking - option 1

Event access via Rangiriri off-ramps only. Follow the signs and park in school grounds in Murphy Street. Walk 400m or take shuttle to event.



Parking - option 2

Park at Maurea Marae off Te Ohaki Road on west side of river. Free buses to event site 5 minutes away.

Note: Te Wharepu Road will be closed to through traffic on 16 December until 3pm. Detours will be in place.
