## Zero harm for everyone

Our construction crews are hard at work as summer is the best time to reseal and maintain roads. Warm temperatures and dry air helps the new seal to stick to the existing road surface, creating a more effective and durable result.

Drivers are likely to come across roadwork sites during the next few months. We ask you to please observe speed restrictions and slow down through work sites to help keep everyone safe and able to return home to their families at the end of the day.

### Night works

A combination of good construction weather and a group of projects that are nearing completion gives us kilometres of asphalt that needs to be put in place to give motorists a final surface to drive on.

The asphalting work is done at night when there is less impact on traffic. There is likely to be closures of the motorway overnight for a number of consecutive nights to enable much of the final motorway surface to be laid over the next three months.
