We're rebuilding stronger highways and rail for thriving East Coast communities

The Transport Rebuild East Coast (TREC) Alliance is a partnership between NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi (NZTA), KiwiRail, Downer, Fulton Hogan and Higgins.

TREC has been set up and teams are working hard and fast to create strong reconnections. For the recovery work more than 400 recovery sites were identified for repair and construction, over a hundred sites have been completed, other sites are being planned (design) or are in construction.

Working collaboratively with local businesses

We're working in partnership with a strong pool of hard-working, skilled and experienced local people, contractors and suppliers who understand the East Coast whenua. We will need more people on the ground, as well as others working around Aotearoa. While providing opportunities we're mindful of not taking critical roles away from other recovery organisations working to support communities.
