Adding no stopping lines on state highways


You cannot stop, wait, or park on a road where there are broken yellow lines at any time. These lines are in place to protect the safety of pedestrians and other road users.

The NZ Transport Agency manages no stopping lines for state highways, and councils manage them for local roads.

No stopping lines can only be changed or introduced after a bylaw is changed. This isn't something that can be done immediately, as it takes time for the assessment and consultation to be undertaken.

REVIEWING NO STOPPING LINES

To request a review of no stopping lines on a state highway, please contact the Transport Agency.



THINGS WE CONSIDER

Before adding no stopping lines, we take into consideration:

- It is illegal to park or stop a vehicle on, or closer than six metres to, an intersection, unless there are parking spaces or a notice telling you that you can park there.
- It is illegal to park or stop your vehicle in a cycle lane or in a bus or transit lane during the hours of operation as indicated by signs.
- It is illegal to park or stop your vehicle on, in front of, or closer than one metre to, a vehicle entrance.
