Proof of name change

If you want to change the name on your driver licence or if the name on your identity documents isn't the same as the name on your licence, you'll need to provide acceptable evidence of name change. This must be an original (not a copy) of one of the following documents issued in New Zealand:

- your marriage or civil union certificate
- your copy of particulars of marriage or civil union
- your dissolution of marriage or civil union order
- a certificate of annulment
- a deed poll certificate, change of name certificate, or birth certificate showing both names
- a statutory declaration issued by Births, Deaths and Marriages confirming the name change.

Note: if your evidence of identity and name change documents don't provide a clear link to the name currently on your driver licence, you may be required to provide additional documentation.

Responsibilities

Driver licences make our roads safer for everyone and prove drivers are qualified and legally entitled to be behind the wheel. That's why it's important you always carry your licence with you when you drive.

If your old licence is replaced by a new version, you must surrender the old version under s30 of the Land Transport Act 1998.

Warning

It's an offence to supply false or misleading information and may lead to court action. The consequences can include losing your licence and/or paying a fine. If you don't supply all relevant information, your application may be delayed or declined.

Privacy information

The information requested is required for NZTA (and its agents) to process your application for a driver licence, to produce your photo driver licence card, and to maintain the Driver Licence Register. Collection of this information is required by part 3 of the Land Transport (Driver Licensing) Rule 1999.

Your photo may be captured for the purpose of printing it on your driver licence card. Your photo may also be used by the Department of Internal Affairs, Department of Corrections, Ministry of Justice, Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (Immigration), New Zealand Customs Service, and the New Zealand Police for the purposes of identity verification and law enforcement under section 200 of the Land Transport Act 1998, or for one of the purposes outlined in part 7 of the Privacy Act 2020. Your photo may therefore be disclosed to one of these agencies, for one of these purposes.

NZTA (and its agents) will hold, store, use, and disclose any personal information collected on this form in accordance with the Land Transport Act 1998 and the Privacy Act 2020 (part 7, in particular, which authorises the disclosure of this information in certain circumstances). NZTA (and its agents) may also use some of these particulars to provide you with information relating to driver licensing and driving, or to contact you for feedback on our services.

To assist in keeping the Electoral Roll up-to-date, the Electoral Enrolment Centre operates an authorised information matching programme with NZTA under s263B of the Electoral Act 1993.

To keep the Driver Licence Register up-to-date NZTA also operates an authorised information matching programme with Births, Deaths and Marriages. Please refer to the Privacy section of our website for more information.

Practical tests

You must provide the vehicle for the test. It must:

- be the same weight and type as the licence class you're applying for.
- be clean, tidy and safe
- have a current vehicle licence displayed, and a current road user charges (RUC) licence displayed if applicable.
- have a current certificate of fitness (CoF) or warrant of fitness (WoF) displayed and meet CoF or WoF standards (we recommend you arrive at the test site at least 15 minutes before your test time so you can check that your vehicle is up to WoF or CoF standard before the test starts).

If your vehicle doesn't meet these standards, you won't be able to sit the test.

If you're sitting your restricted licence practical test in an automatic vehicle your licence will only allow you to drive automatic vehicles.

If you normally wear glasses or lenses to drive make sure you bring them with you to the test.
