

Mercedes Benz – Revision 1

You must read [Guide to importing a vehicle](#) in conjunction with this information.

All fully German-assembled, right-hand drive, Class MA Mercedes Benz vehicles that were first registered new anywhere after 1 January 1992 will comply with New Zealand's frontal impact standards.

The C Class model W203 introduced in 2000 will comply with New Zealand's frontal impact standards. The first three characters of this C Class model's VIN are the letters WDC.

Recognising a fully German-assembled model:

Examine the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN). German-assembled vehicles all have a VIN that:

- Starts with the letters WDB or **WDD**
and
- Has a 10th character of 2.

For example, the VIN of a German-assembled E280 model is:

WDB 210053 **2**A 303065
