Purpose

To notify approved organisations and other stakeholders of the release of new finalised NZ Transport Agency guidelines for preparing regional public transport plans (Note these replace the Interim guidelines released in October 2013).

Background

The Land Transport Management Act 2003 was amended in June 2013. These amendments and NZ Transport Agency operational policy changes to implement them mean there are new requirements for regional public transport plans (RPTPs). These changes are part of the wider Public Transport Operating Model (PTOM) announced by the government in 2012.

To support implementation of the changes, in October 2013 the Transport Agency issued and consulted with the sector on Interim guidelines for the development of Regional Public Transport Plans.

Based on the feedback received, these guidelines have now been finalised. Before adopting an RPTP, Regional councils must be satisfied the RPTP has been prepared in accordance with the guidelines. The Transport Agency also recently amended its Procurement Manual. These changes combine to give effect to the operational policy components of PTOM.
