Objective of the Rule

Land Transport Rule: Tyres and Wheels Amendment 2019 (the amendment Rule) amends Land Transport Rule: Tyres and Wheels 2001 (the Tyres and Wheels Rule). The Tyres and Wheels Rule sets safety requirements and standards for tyres and wheels and their assembly with hubs and axles, on all motor vehicles and pedal cycles.

The objectives of the amendment Rule are to—

- remove an out-of-date transitional provision and provide that all tyres in a twin tyre set fitted to a motor vehicle of class NA, NB, NC, TC, or TD must comply with certain tread-pattern requirements:
- provide for tyres on heavy vehicles to have a maximum cold inflation pressure of more than 825 kPa, up to 900 kPa, if the manufacturer of the tyre or vehicle specifies an inflation pressure higher than 825 kPa:
- remove an out-of-date transitional provision relating to tyre pressure control systems:
- update the definition of **gross vehicle mass** to align with changes made to the *Land Transport Act 1998* in 2017.

Extent of consultation

For the purposes of consultation, amendments proposed to the Tyres and Wheels Rule and 14 other Land Transport Rules were combined into a single Rule, *Land Transport Rule: Regulatory Stewardship (Omnibus) Amendment 2018* (the Omnibus Amendment Rule). Following consultation, the provisions in the Omnibus Amendment Rule were split into separate amendment Rules.

The NZ Transport Agency sent details of the amendment proposals by letter or email to approximately 2544 groups and individuals who had registered an interest in the Rules to be amended. The Omnibus Amendment Rule was made available through the NZ Transport Agency's Contact Centre and, together with Questions and Answers, was also available on the NZ Transport Agency's website. The availability of the amendment proposals for comment was publicised in the daily newspapers in Auckland, Hamilton, Wellington, Christchurch and Dunedin. It was also notified in the *New Zealand Gazette* on 23 July 2018.

The NZ Transport Agency received 41 submissions on the Omnibus Amendment Rule, of which 13 commented on the proposed amendments to the Tyres and Wheels Rule.

The submissions received were taken into account in finalising the draft Rule following which it was submitted to the Associate Minister of Transport for signing.

(ii) if the manufacturer of the tyre or vehicle specifies an inflation pressure higher than 825 kPa, that inflation pressure, to a maximum of 900 kPa.

2.4 Part 2 amended (Definitions)

In *Part 2*, replace the definition of **gross vehicle mass** with:

gross vehicle mass has the same meaning as in *section 2(1)* of the *Land Transport Act 1998*
