**Request made under the Official Information Act 1982**

Thank you for your online submission of 15 June 2024 to the NZ Police requesting the following information under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act):

*All emails, reports, incident forms relating to the decision to deploy a speed camera to Ohiro road on 2 June. The exact location of the camera when deployed ; the operator of the camera; the service history of the camera including any faults over the previous two years and when and how it was last calibrated for accuracy. In relation to the position of the camera: how many serious injury, minor injury and non injury accidents have there been within 500 metres either side of the camera's position in each of the previous five years; how many complaints of speeding vehicles there have been by residents living 1km either side of the cameras position in the previous five years; how many fines have been issued by cameras in this location in each of the previous five years together with the dollar total.*

The following section of your request was transferred to NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi (NZTA) on 24 June 2024 as the information requested is more closely aligned with our functions:

*In relation to the position of the camera: how many serious injury, minor injury and non injury accidents have there been within 500 metres either side of the camera's position in each of the previous five years;*
