ROAD SURFACE WORK: MILLING, CHIP SEALING AND ASPHALTING

The Christchurch Northern Corridor (CNC) Alliance team together with the Christchurch City Council have inspected the road surface on where to repair and increase the thickness, needed for the new asphalt.

Construction and traffic impact

On **Thursday 28 November** we will be milling the side streets and some patches of Cranford Street outside the Cranford Alehouse and around McFaddens Road intersection. The surface there needs extra milling before we can chip seal and then asphalt. On **Friday and Monday to Wednesday** we are chip sealing and asphaltting.

To resurface the road, traffic will remain on the east (Mairehau) side of the road, so we can mill, chip seal and asphalt the opposite (west) lanes.

During the work there will be a **30km/h speed limit** in place; Knowles Street, Weston Road and McFaddens Road remain closed on the west (St. Albans) side of Cranford Street and left-in left-out on the east side.

Access to homes and businesses will be maintained, except when the milling or asphalt machine is passing. On-street parking will be very limited.

Temporary bus stops have been set up, signs will indicate the interim bus stop areas.

When the surface is new it is more likely to become damaged. Please be careful.

In December the team will move to the other side of Cranford Street to repair and asphalt the east shoulder. This side of the road should not take as long, as the road surface issues and solutions have already been agreed.

Traffic management will be swapped to the other side of the road with side streets on the east side closed. The milling machine and rollers will be noisy and cause low vibrations.

Night work

On Monday evening 9 December, the crew will asphalt on Cranford Street in front of Kidd's Cakes and Bakery. Nearby residents will hear the noise from the machinery and the crew working at night.
