

Christchurch Northern Corridor Cranford Street Upgrade

PROJECT UPDATE

28 JANUARY 2020



Milling the road will be noisy. Please take care around the work site during the surfacing.

ROAD SURFACE WORK CRANFORD STREET

The Christchurch Northern Corridor (CNC) Alliance team will be starting the road surface work on the east (Mairehau) side from **Monday 3 February**. Work starts north of McFaddens Road on Cranford Street, see yellow dash in photo.

Construction and traffic impact

From **Monday morning 3 February** two way traffic will shift to the west (St. Albans) side of the road. There will be no on-street parking available on the east side, apart from a drop off zone for Small World preschool. The side streets McFaddens Road, Weston Road and Knowles Street are closed on the east side so we can mill the intersections. Vehicle access for residents will be available outside work hours.

The week of Monday 3 and Monday 10 February we are milling the southbound lane, from opposite PlaceMakers to Knowles Street. First milling, then structural asphalt will be applied, then chip sealing and to finish with the final top layer of asphalt. Before the top layer can be applied there will be people on site inspecting the road.

During the work there will be a **30km/h speed limit** in place. Temporary bus stops will be set up, signs will indicate the interim bus stop areas.

Access for residents

Access to homes and businesses will be maintained as much as possible. Vehicle access to driveways will be restricted when the milling machine is passing and while we are chip sealing and asphaltting. Residents are advised to get their car(s) out of their driveway by 7am for usage during the day.

Work will finish by 10pm. A coned off lane is available for residents' access to their homes. Enter this coned off lane going south/citybound, left in and out only. Please ensure you are in the southbound lane coming home or make a U-turn on Cranford Street north near the shopping area. It is best to park your car in the side streets during the day.

When the surface is new it is more likely to become damaged. Please be careful. The milling machine and rollers will be noisy and cause low vibrations.

There is no work happening on Waitangi Day, 6 February and on Friday 7 February.

By Friday 14 February the final layer of asphalt should be complete. In the week of Monday 17 February a similar traffic set up will be in place to raise the lids of fire hydrants and other underground services to the new level of the road and to paint the lines.
