SURFACE WORK CNC MOTORWAY ALIGNMENT FOR TWO MONTHS

To make the most of the nice weather and to win back time lost during the Covid-19 lock down period we are increasing our work hours on site. This will allow us to complete the surfacing work on the full motorway alignment and be ready for opening in December this year.

Our surfacing crew is starting at the southern end of the new motorway on Thursday 8 October and will move north. For about three days during the day and evening this work will be near your property. Nearby residents will hear the noise from the machinery and may notice ground vibrations from the graders and compactors. The crews are fast moving so within three days they will move further north on the alignment to work on the next lot of surfacing.

Construction Impact

The work is happening between 6am and 12am.

For the surfacing work we first use foam bitumen stabilisation, which involves large trucks and heavy machinery and once in train can do 300m a day. We will then apply chip seal. In between the foaming and chip sealing, the cement needs to harden for one or two days. No work will be happening then. Nearby residents will hear the noise from the machinery, trucks and the crew working.

Thank you for your ongoing patience and cooperation. The final quieter asphalt surface will be applied when the chip seal has been down for one year.
