

HILL STREET INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS



PUBLIC CONSULTATION

The NZ Transport Agency and Auckland Transport are working together on a business case for long term improvements to the Hill Street intersection.

A number of options for long term improvements at the Hill Street intersection have been considered. These focus on simplifying traffic movements, improving current congestion issues and providing for future transport needs.

All transport project teams in Warkworth are working together to develop a safe walking and cycling network which will shape the way people travel in and around Warkworth in the future.

Two options have been shortlisted and we are now seeking feedback on them.

AN INTEGRATED PLAN FOR GROWTH IN WARKWORTH

Warkworth is set to become home to five times as many people over the next 30 years.

Upgrading the Hill Street intersection is an important part of wider transport plans being investigated that both respond to today's safety and congestion issues and plan ahead for future travel demands.

When they open over the next few years, the Matakana Link Road and Pūhoi to Warkworth motorway will ease some of the pressure at the Hill Street intersection.

However, with the additional population and future urban development expected in Warkworth over the next few decades, the Supporting Growth Programme is also

considering other alternative connections, new investment in public transport, and improvements to walking and cycling, that will all help provide a wider range of travel choices in the long term for people to access their homes, schools, town centres and surrounding areas.

Our options for the Hill Street improvements are being developed in collaboration with these other projects, to ensure they work together in an integrated way. There may be a need to phase the improvements at the Hill Street intersection to align with these projects, and when future development is completed.
