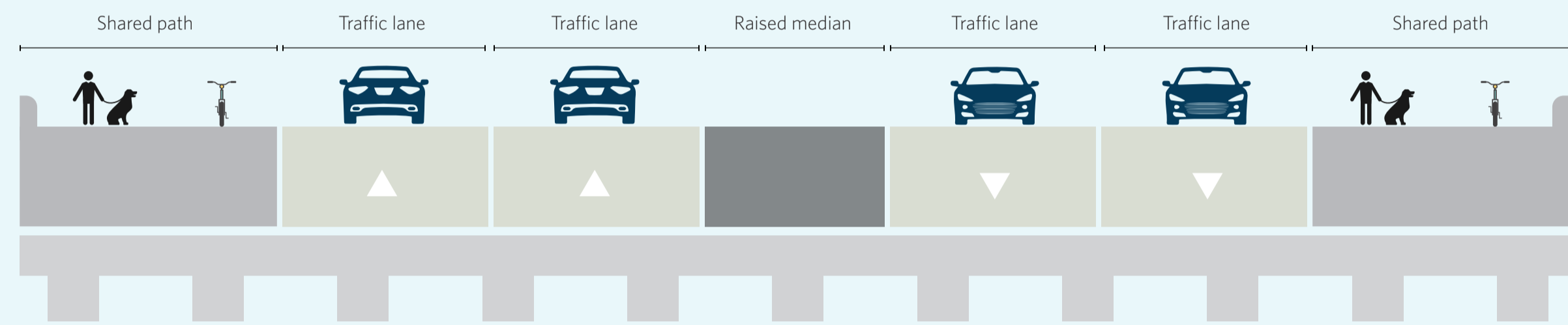
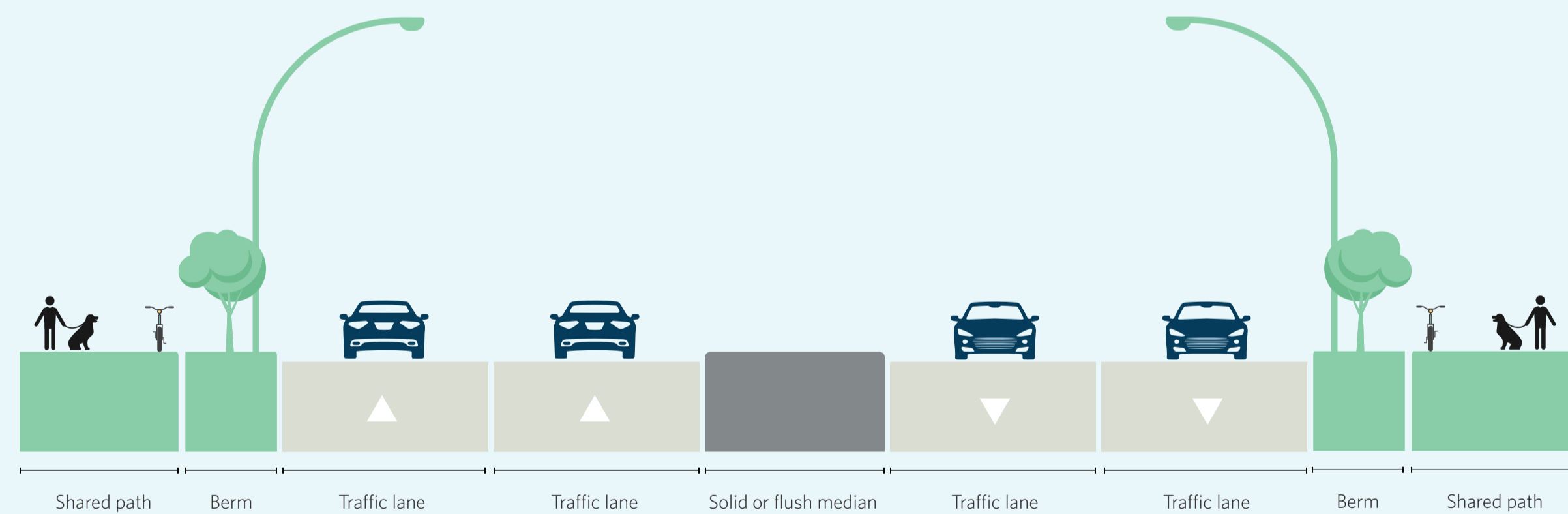


SH22 Drury Upgrade

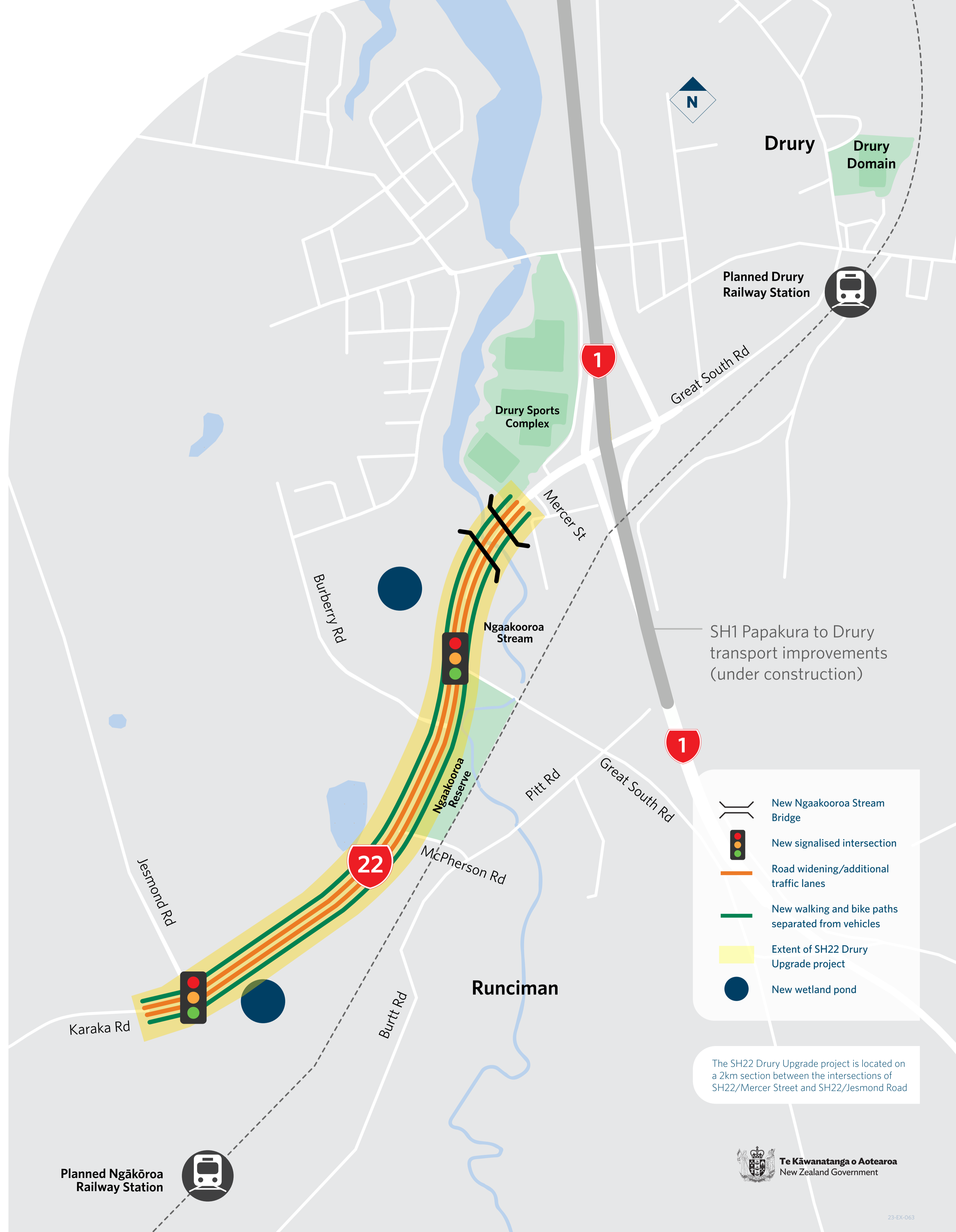
The SH22 Drury Upgrade Project will provide connections by foot, bike, and vehicle to the planned Ngākōroa Railway Station and Drury West housing development area.

We are proposing an upgrade to part of State Highway 22 at Drury under the New Zealand Upgrade Programme to provide growing communities with better transport choices that help people get where they're going safely.

Mana Whenua

Our partnership with Mana Whenua

We are working in partnership with Mana Whenua to deliver the SH22 Drury Upgrade project following the principles of Te Ara Kotahi, our strategy for partnering with Māori, which recognises and provides for cultural heritage, identity and Mātauranga Māori.

In undertaking this project we recognise the relationships of Mana Whenua with the land and waterways of Aotearoa New Zealand and their unbroken, living connections across the land, waterways and time.

Te kaupapa

Key features

- additional lanes (from two to four) to better connect to the Drury Interchange upgrade
- signalised intersections at SH22 Karaka Road/Jesmond Road and SH22 Karaka Road/Great South Road
- walking and biking paths separated from vehicles
- replacement of existing Ngaakoora Stream bridge
- new bridge raised for better resilience to flooding and future climate change effects.

Key benefits

- makes walking/biking/using public transport a better, safer option, helping to reduce car dependence
- addresses existing safety issues
- better connecting communities to public transport networks, including commuter rail, to better manage congestion and lower emissions
- more reliable connections for communities and businesses.
