Whanganui to Westmere



We want to make your roads safer for everyone who uses them. On some roads we're doing this with safety improvements like rumble strips, but on State Highway 3 (SH3) the best thing we can do to prevent people from dying or being seriously injured is reduce speed limits, so they are safe and right for the road.

Speed increases both the likelihood of crashes and the severity of crashes when they happen. A small reduction in speed can make a big difference, especially when cyclists or pedestrians are involved. Most crashes are caused by a number of factors, but even when it's not the cause of a crash, speed is most likely to determine whether anyone is killed, injured, or walks away unharmed.

Formal consultation on the new speed limit proposals is required under the Land Transport Rule: Setting of Speed Limits (2017).

WHAT WE HAVE HEARD

People in your community have told us that the speed limit on SH3 between Whanganui and Westmere feels too high to be safe.

WHAT WE KNOW

Whanganui is growing, and the way this road is used has changed. There are more homes in this area, and the current speeds are no longer safe and appropriate.

There have been 21 crashes on this stretch of road in the last ten years (2009 to 2018). Two people died and three were seriously injured in these crashes.

To make it safer we're proposing to change the speed limits.
