State Highway 35 (SH35)

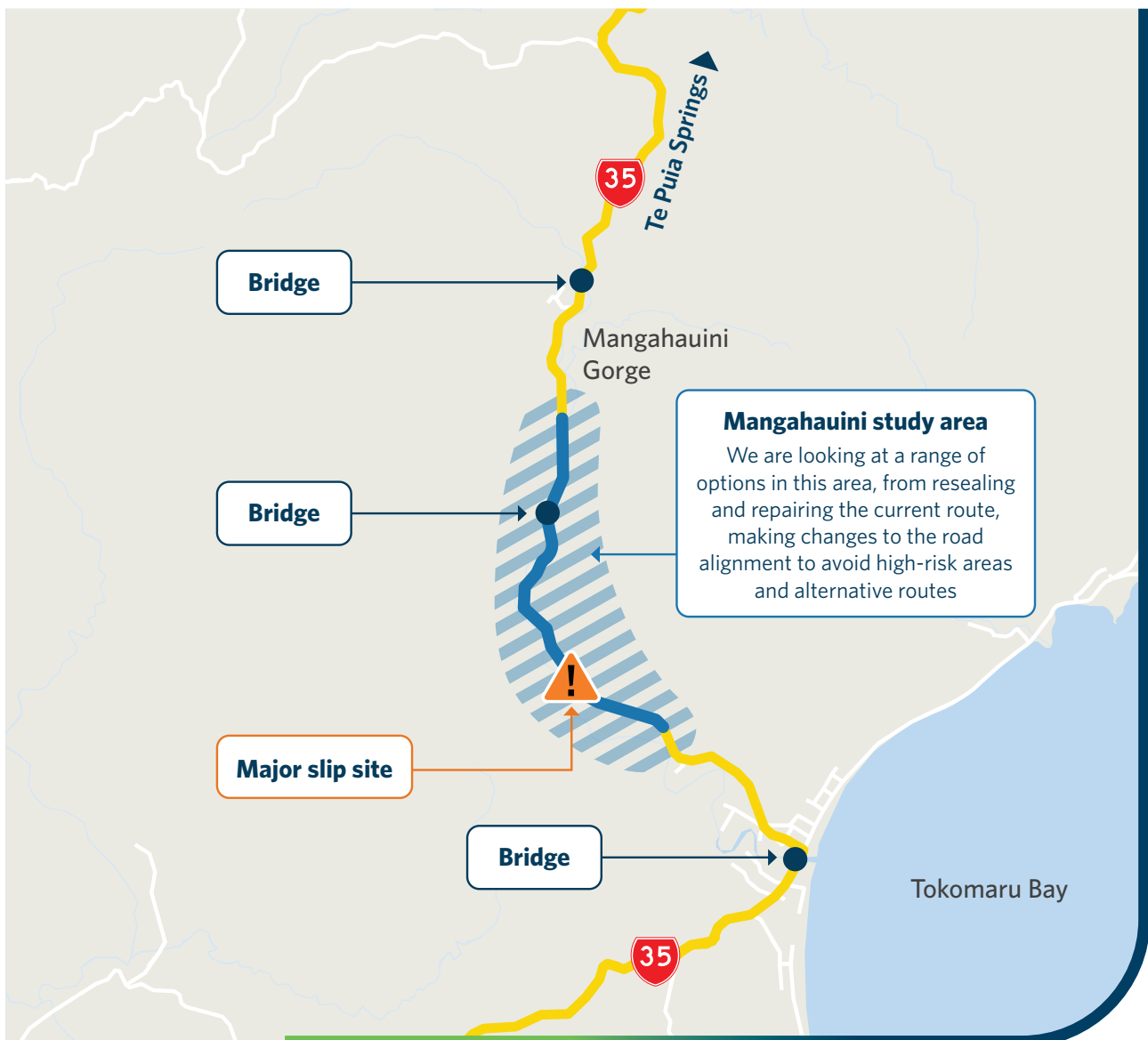
We're committed to restoring safe access on SH35 and planning for its long-term stability after Cyclone Gabrielle.

Construction crews are working on the most critical and damaged sites to keep the corridor open while we explore longer term fixes for high-risk locations.

Over the coming months we are also undertaking a full corridor assessment for the length of SH35. We want to better understand the scale of resilience risks and what might need to be done in the future so we can scope future projects.

The Mangahauini Gorge area remains vulnerable. Constant maintenance and monitoring are required to keep it open. We're exploring a range of ideas including:

- Resealing and repairing the current route
- Making changes to the road alignment to avoid areas that are susceptible to slips and damage
- Or exploring new route options

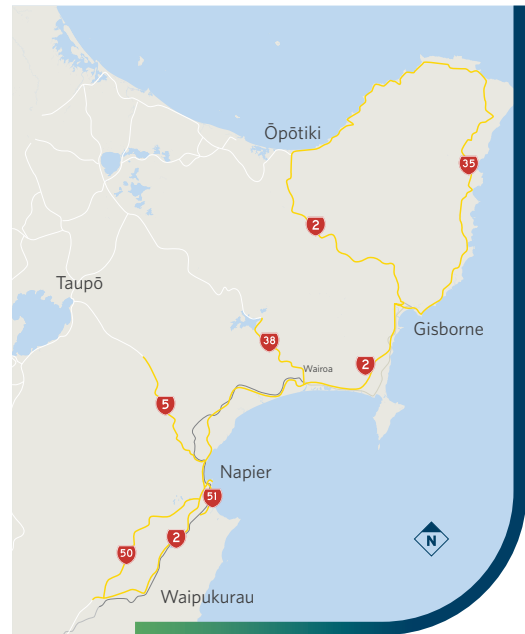
