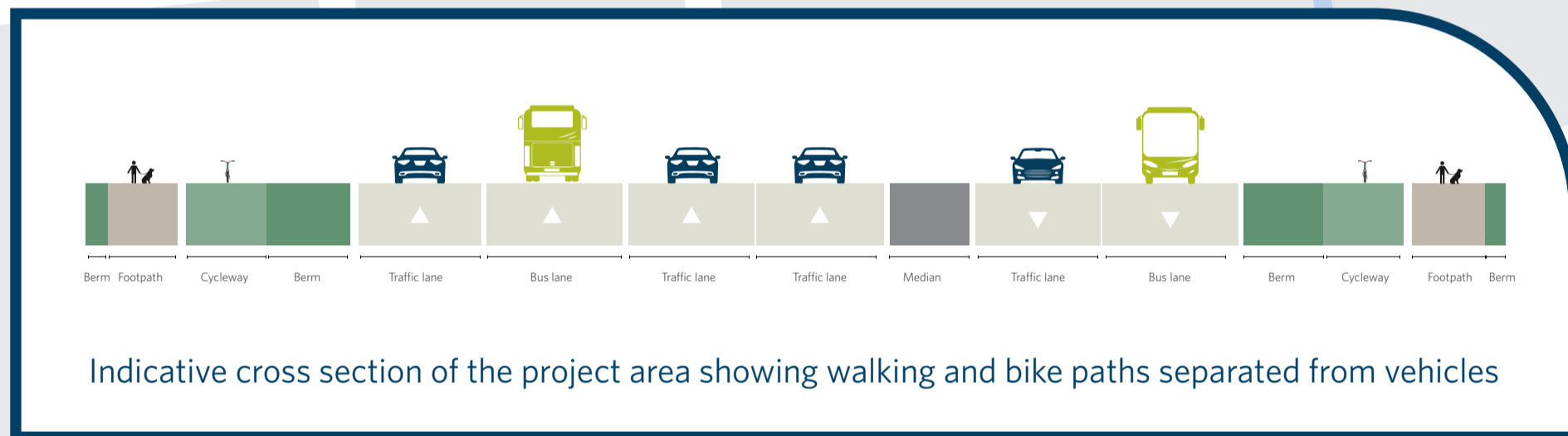
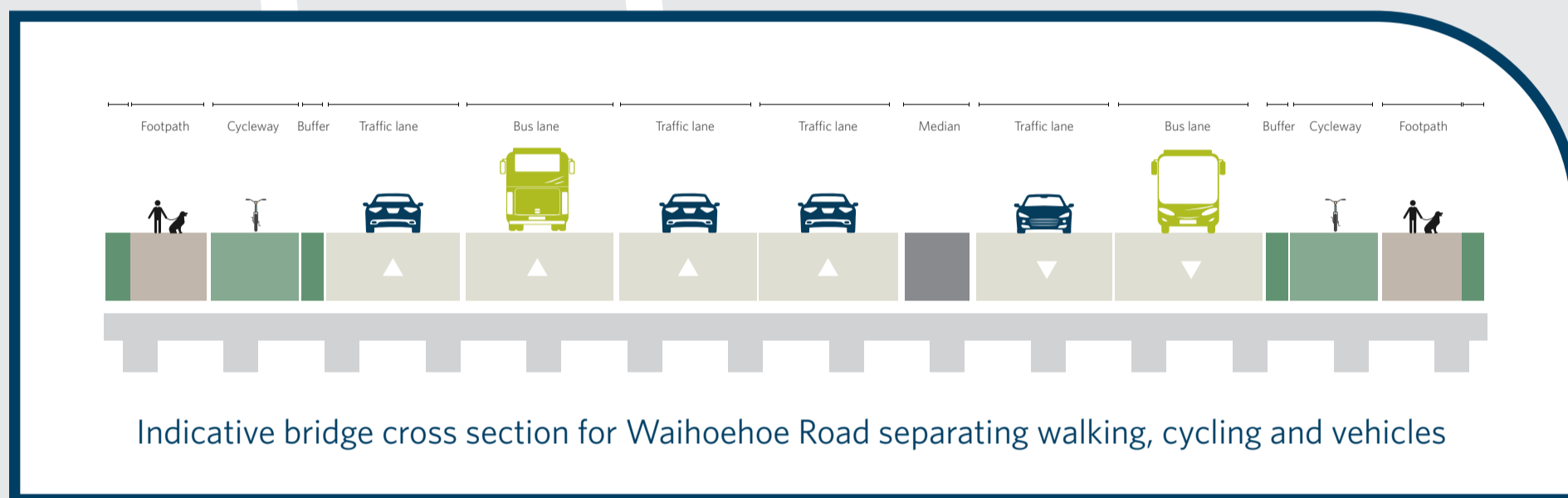


# Waihoehoe Road upgrade

The Waihoehoe Road upgrade project will provide connections by foot, bike and vehicle to the planned Drury East housing development area and the new Drury Railway Station, and link to the SH1 Papakura to Drury improvements.

The Waihoehoe Road upgrade is on 400 metres of Waihoehoe Road between Great South Road and Kath Henry Lane.

## Mana Whenua

### Our partnership with Mana Whenua

We are working in partnership with Mana Whenua to deliver the Waihoehoe Road upgrade project following the principles of Te Ara Kotahi, our strategy for partnering with Māori, which recognises and provides for cultural heritage, identity and Mātauranga Māori.

In undertaking this project we recognise the relationships of Mana Whenua with the land and waterways of Aotearoa New Zealand and their unbroken, living connections across the land, waterways and time.

## Te kaupapa

### Key features

- additional lanes (from two to four), and up to six lanes on Waihoehoe Road bridge
- signalised intersections at Waihoehoe Road/Great South Road and Waihoehoe Road/Kath Henry Lane
- walking and bike paths separated from vehicles
- a new, higher bridge over the North Island Main Trunk Line - this will also enable the Papakura to Pukekohe rail line electrification
- capacity for future bus lanes.

## Nga hua o te kaupapa

### Key benefits

- makes walking/biking/using public transport a better and safer option, helping to reduce car dependence and lower carbon emissions
- addresses existing safety issues
- ensures growing communities are well linked to public transport networks, including commuter rail, to better manage congestion and emissions
- provides more reliable connections for communities and businesses.

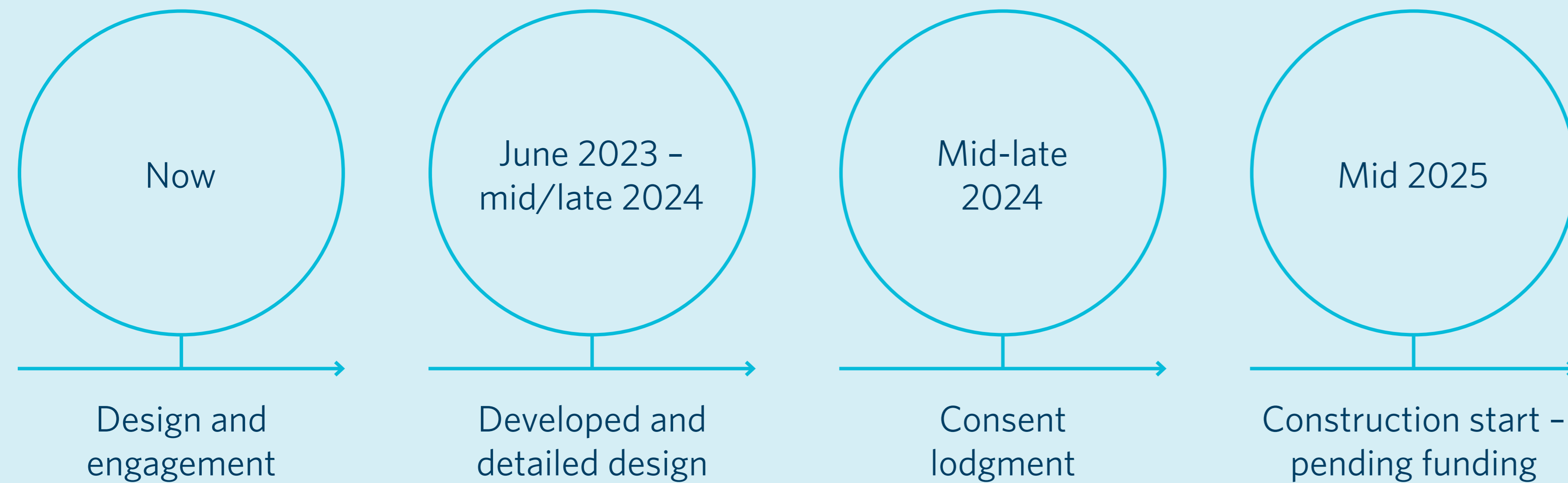




# Waihoehoe Road upgrade

## Project timeline

We will seek your feedback on the designs and will keep you updated throughout the project lifecycle.



### September 2023

We want to hear your thoughts on how the project can create positive outcomes.

### November 2023

We will share the updated project designs and seek your feedback on areas for further development.

We also want to explore any concerns you may have on construction impacts so we can make plans early to minimise disruptions.

### Early-mid 2024

We will seek your feedback to inform the final detailed designs.

We will talk with those directly impacted by construction works to inform planning for the physical works.

## Site investigations:

### September-November update

We're preparing the next phase of investigations needed to further develop the designs for the Waihoehoe Road upgrade project.

These include geotechnical and topographical investigations on some private properties and on public land, including within the road reserve. The investigations include a utility services check, geotechnical cone penetration testing and machine drilled boreholes with the possibility of hydro excavation for locating buried utility services.

There will be some temporary disruption to drivers and pedestrians while this work is being undertaken between early September and late November this year.
