AN UPDATED FLYOVER OF THE WESTERN BELFAST BYPASS HAS BEEN POSTED

If you want to see what's happening on the Western Belfast Bypass project, this [fly over video](#) gives you a bird's eye view. The contractor is busy working away behind the scenes to get this project finished on schedule in early 2018.

The five kilometre bypass is designed to ease traffic congestion to the north of the city and divert heavy vehicles off Main North Road. It will link the Christchurch Northern Motorway to

Johns Rd just south of the Groyne recreational area, supporting access to the growing north and west of the city.

Ground strengthen work is now giving way to bridge construction at the overpass locations – Groyne Drive, Dickeys Road and the new on-ramp to the Northern Motorway. Street lights and curbing is already in place on the middle stretch of new motorway.
