Having a safe, reliable route to and from
Wellington is vital. With funding from the
Government's accelerated regional roading
package, the Transport Agency is investigating
options to replace the Whirokino Trestle and to
strengthen or replace the Manawatu River Bridge.



Why is this work so important?

The Whirokino Trestle is reaching the end of its life and doesn't meet current standards. It's due to be replaced within the next 10-20 years. The Manawatu River Bridge is also below current standards. This leads to some larger freight trucks having to take a longer route to get to and from Wellington.

Other needs include building wider lanes and safer road edges, a dedicated space for cyclists as well as reducing the impact of the trestle and bridge on the flood plain.

Replacing the Whirokino Trestle and strengthening or replacing the Manawatu River Bridge will bring them up to modern safety standards and make travel for freight vehicles more efficient.




OF WHICH 1,100 (OR 14.1%) ARE HEAVY VEHICLES





The options



We're investigating four options:

- Options 1 and 1A involve different routes and replacing both the Whirokino Trestle and the Manawatu River Bridge
- Options 2 and 2A follow similar routes to the existing bridges.
 Option 2A involves upgrading and strengthening the existing Manawatu River Bridge.

To select a preferred option we're:

- exploring design plans and cost estimates
- looking at the ecological effects of each option
- identifying any significant archaeological areas or features
- measuring the noise impact on neighbouring properties
- considering the effects on the landscape
- considering land requirements
- talking to tangata whenua, landowners and the local community

Our next steps will involve analysing your feedback, the results of which will be available early next year.



Current timeline

If funding is granted from the Government's accelerated regional roading package, detailed design, and land purchase will begin in June 2015, followed by construction. Otherwise, we'll continue to maintain the trestle and bridge, and the project will be subject to the normal funding process, ie from the National Land Transport Programme.
