- Evidence of identity** (must be original - no photocopies).
You must provide either:
 - your New Zealand photo driver licence (can be current or expired up to 2 years), or
 - your current New Zealand passport, or
 - your current overseas driver licence and your current overseas passport, or
 - your New Zealand birth certificate (issued on or after 1 January 1998) and a student ID card, Kiwi Access or 18+ card, power bill or bank statement*, or
 - another combination of acceptable evidence of identity documents* detailed on *Identification for driver licensing* (Factsheet 20) or at www.nzta.govt.nz/identification

*If neither document has a photo, you'll also need to provide a verified image (see Factsheet 20 for more information).

What to bring (continued)

- Evidence of name change** (must be original - no photocopies).
If you want to change the name on your driver licence, or if the name on your identity documents isn't the same as the name on your licence, you'll need to provide acceptable evidence of name change. This must be one of the following that was issued in New Zealand:
 - your marriage or civil union certificate
 - your copy of particulars of marriage or civil union
 - your dissolution of marriage or civil union order
 - a certificate of annulment
 - a deed poll certificate, change of name certificate, or birth certificate showing both names
 - a statutory declaration issued by Births, Deaths and Marriages confirming the name change.

Note: if your evidence of identity and name change documents don't provide a clear link to the name currently on your driver licence, you may be required to provide additional documentation.

Where to apply

Take your completed form and all **original** documents to any driver licensing agent. To find an agent go to www.nzta.govt.nz/agent

The agent will process your application, check your identification, may take your photograph and a sample signature for your licence as well as check your eyesight.

Eyesight

You'll need to pass an eyesight check at the agent.

If you don't pass the check, you'll need to present a satisfactory eyesight or medical certificate. The certificate must be issued by a New Zealand-registered optometrist or health practitioner, and be no more than 60 days old. You can present a certificate instead of doing the eyesight check if you prefer.

If you have sight in only one eye, or have only one eye (monocular vision) you'll need to present an eyesight certificate.

Responsibilities

Driver licences make our roads safer for everyone and prove drivers are qualified and legally entitled to be behind the wheel. You must always carry your licence with you when you drive.

Your address will be recorded on the Driver Licence Register. Please notify NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi (NZTA) immediately if you change your address.

If your old driver licence is replaced by a new version, you must surrender the old version under s30 of the Land Transport Act 1998.

It's an offence to supply false or misleading information and may lead to court action. You could lose your licence or get a fine.

Privacy information

The information requested is required for NZTA (and its agents) to process your application for a driver licence, to produce your photo driver licence card, and to maintain the Driver Licence Register. Collection of this information is required by part 3 of the Land Transport (Driver Licensing) Rule 1999.

Your photo will be captured for the purpose of printing it on your driver licence card. Your photo may also be used by the Department of Corrections, Ministry of Justice, Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (Immigration), New Zealand Customs Service, and the New Zealand Police for the purposes of identity verification and law enforcement under s200 of the Land Transport Act 1998, or for one of the purposes outlined in part 7 of the Privacy Act 2020. Your photo may therefore be disclosed to one of these agencies, for one of these purposes.

NZTA (and its agents) will hold, store, use, and disclose any personal information collected on this form in accordance with the Land Transport Act 1998 and the Privacy Act 2020 (part 7, in particular, which authorises the disclosure of this information in certain circumstances). NZTA (and its agents) may also use some of these particulars to provide you with information relating to driver licensing and driving, or to contact you for feedback on our services.

To assist in keeping the Electoral Roll up-to-date, the Electoral Enrolment Centre operates an authorised information matching programme with NZTA under s263B of the Electoral Act 1993.
