Vehicle inspection

Please make sure your vehicle has a current warrant of fitness (WoF) or certificate of fitness (CoF).

Some vehicles are exempt from the safety inspection requirement (for example mopeds or agricultural motor vehicles operated at 40km/h or less). For more information go to www.nzta.govt.nz/wof-exempt

You can license for 1 to 12 months. If you want to change your licence to a specific expiry date, lodge an Application to change licence expiry date (MR27) form.

Vehicle usage notes:

- Goods vehicles with a gross vehicle mass (GVM) of 6000kg or greater. You must also have a goods service licence.
- 2 Goods vehicles with a GVM of less than 6000kg - for example, courier vehicle, domestic trailer, light goods vehicle.
- Certain vehicles of specified design or use must be registered but are exempt from other requirements. However, please note that EB vehicles are no longer exempt from road user charges (RUC). For more information go to www.nzta.govt.nz/vehicle-exemptions. Factsheet 27 also provides a plain English summary and guide to the registration and licensing of exempt vehicles. - Only the following vehicles can be licensed as Exempt Class A:
 - a pedestrian-controlled goods service vehicle

- a motor vehicle propelled and supported solely by self-laying tracks
- an all-terrain vehicle (ATV)
- mobile machinery used only in road construction zones.
- a logging truck or logging trailer that is unladen and is only used on a road while being taken directly to a place of, and for the purpose of, inspection, servicing, repair or obtaining evidence of vehicle inspection.
- Vehicles designed to transport special purpose equipment, rather than for carrying goods for example, trailer type caravans, tractors, graders, or self-propelled cranes.
- Agricultural vehicles are vehicles designed, constructed or adapted for agricultural purposes, and include agricultural tractors and agricultural trailers. For a full definition of an agricultural vehicle go to www.nzta.govt.nz/agricultural

Continuous vehicle licensing (CVL) and exemptions

If your vehicle is subject to CVL* and its licence has expired, you will need to pay licensing fees from the expiry date of the last licence/exemption.

*Most vehicles are subject to CVL and must be licensed at all times. If a CVL vehicle is unlicensed for more than 12 months, its registration will be cancelled. Outstanding licensing fees will remain payable and this debt will be referred to our debt collection agency. Additional costs may also be charged at this time. If you sell an unlicensed vehicle, you must pay for the licensing fees up until the date of sale.

If the vehicle is to going to be unlicensed for more than 3 months, you can apply for an exemption from licensing in advance at www.nzta.govt.nz/online, or you can lodge an Application for exemption from continuous licensing (MR24) form at an agent. If you need to license the vehicle before the minimum 3-month exemption period has ended, you'll have to pay licensing fees from the date the previous licence/exemption expired. You don't need a current WoF or CoF to get an exemption.

Fees

The fees include the appropriate licence fee payable under Part 17 of the Land Transport Act 1998, an accident compensation levy payable under the Accident Compensation Act 2001 (except for trailers and a few specified vehicles) and where applicable, a transport licence fee. An administration and label fee is charged on every licence application. The administration fee is cheaper online at www.nzta.govt.nz/online
