Key

Rank 1 – *Straightforward* – this represents a situation where all that is required is an Outline Plan of Works. It may also include amendments to plans submitted in compliance with conditions imposed on the designation or resource consent; such amendments to plans raise minor issues and can be undertaken in an informal way with council’s agreement;

Rank 2 – *Relatively Straightforward* – this represents a situation where an Outline Plan of Works is required and amendments to plans submitted in compliance with any conditions imposed on the designation or resource consent; while such amendments can be undertaken in an informal way;

issues being addressed may be of interest to council who may wish to have a close input into the process. Regional consents may also be required;

Rank 3 – *Some Difficulty* – this represents a situation where an Outline Plan of Works is required that addresses matters of interest to council and amendments to plans submitted in compliance with any conditions imposed on the designation or resource consent; while such amendments can be undertaken in an informal way; issues being raised are of high interest to council and the community and a process of consultation and engagement may be required. The situation may require an alteration to designation and regional consents;

Rank 4 – *Difficult* – this represents a number of situations where an alteration to the designation is required as the current designation does not provide for the works proposed; where new regional consents are required; these processes would require consultation and engagement with council and the community;

Rank 5 – *Most Difficult* – this represents a number of situation where an alteration is required to an existing designation or a new designation is required; where new resource consents may be required; these processes would require consultation and engagement with council and the community. A situation like this would most likely involve a new notice of requirement and regional consents (which would be discretionary or non-complying activities).

Timeframes

In terms of timeframes, predictably the greater the difficulty ranking, the longer the time periods required to gain approvals (time shown is from lodging of the Outline Plan of Works or consent application with council).

Rank 1 – 20 working days maximum.

Rank 2 – 20 – 30 working days maximum.

Rank 3 – 30 – 40 working days maximum.

Rank 4 – 40 – 50 working days maximum.

Rank 5 – 50 plus working days.

If notification is required, the above timeframes are likely to be increased.
