briefing notes - road safety issues

Waitaki District

New Zealand Transport Agency has prepared this road safety issues report. It is based on reported crash data and trends for the 2004–2008 period.

The intent of the report is to highlight the key road safety issues and be a resource to identify possible ways to reduce the number of road deaths and injuries in Waitaki District.

In each new report one year's data is added to a five year block and the oldest dropped so it is unlikely that the core issues would change radically from report to report.

The issues chosen for this report are drawn from either the most common crash types, those that appear over-represented when Waitaki District is compared to similar local bodies or those with high social cost (high numbers of fatal and serious crashes mainly).

We have included a brief overview of crashes in the district.

We encourage Waitaki District to delve deeper into the highlighted issues, and other road safety issues in the district. Contact the NZTA Performance Information team for additional information from to the Ministry of Transport's Crash Analysis System (CAS). All data and maps in this note are from CAS.



Fatal and Injury crashes Waitaki District 2004 - 2008



Overview

In 2008 on local roads in Waitaki District there were 28 injury crashes and 74 non-injury crashes. In addition there were 62 injury crashes and 79 non-injury crashes on State Highways both as reported by the New Zealand Police.

The table below shows the number of injuries resulting from the 90 injury crashes by rural or urban areas (rural is defined as an area with a speed limit of 80km/h or more).

Overall 60 percent of casualties were from crashes in rural areas. However for fatal and serious injury crashes 65 percent were in rural areas. All the fatalities occurred in rural areas of the district.

The number of deaths in 2008 was the highest in seven years. There are no apparent trends in the crash numbers.



Injury bend - loss of control or head on crashes Waitaki District 2004 - 2008



Bend - loss of control or head on

Between 2004 and 2008 thirty four percent of all injury crashes in Waitaki District were bend - loss of control or head on crashes. These crashes resulted in 11 fatalities, 52 serious injuries and 179 minor injuries.

Crash numbers rose to a high of 37 in 2005 and 2006, and has reduced each year since then.

After drivers lose control their vehicles often crash into roadside hazards such as ditches, banks, poles or trees. Hitting these objects can result in a relatively minor off-road event turning into something far more serious.

The most common roadside hazards struck in injury loss of control or head on crashes on bends in Waitaki District were fences (49), over bank (32), cliff or bank (25) and ditches (24) from a total of 187 objects struck.



- 71 percent of at fault drivers were male
- Most common at fault driver age group 15 -19 years (26 percent of all at fault drivers)
- 15 percent of crashes involved alcohol
- 40 percent of crashes involved speed too fast for the conditions
- 59 percent involved poor handling
- Worst month March
- Worst day of week Saturday,
- Worst time midday pm till 3 pm

Further information about the 94 injury bend - loss of control or head on crashes (2004 to 2008) on State Highways in Waitaki District:

- 10 deaths, 33 serious injuries and 103 minor injuries
- 69 percent of at fault drivers were male
- Most common at fault driver age group 20 - 24 years (22 percent of at fault drivers)
- 20 percent of crashes involved alcohol
- 24 percent of crashes involved speed too fast for the conditions
- 53 percent involved poor handling
- Worst month October
- Worst day of week Saturday
- Worst time period 3 pm to 6 pm

Intersections

During the five year period 2004 to 2008 within Waitaki District there were a total of 318 crashes at intersections, 141 of these were injury crashes and 177 non-injury.

78 percent of these were in urban areas and 3 people were killed, 28 received serious injuries and 161 received minor injuries.

The next ten years—moving beyond Road Safety 2010

In August this year the Ministry of Transport (MoT) will embark on a nationwide road safety consultation programme as it moves to formulate priorities for the next ten years.

The chart on the right illustrates the progress made during the life of the Road Safety 2010 strategy and while progress has been made it would seem unlikely that the target of 300 or fewer fatalities will be met.
